

STUDENT CONDUCT

All student behavior should be based on respect and consideration for the rights of others. Students have a responsibility to know and follow the rules and regulations of the school.

Students shall conduct themselves in keeping with their level of maturity, acting with due regard for the supervisory authority vested by the Board in all District employees, for the educational purpose underlying all school activities, and for the widely shared use of school property.

The principal is responsible for developing and administering reasonable rules and regulations for students. Such rules and regulations shall not conflict with Board policies, statutory law or case law.

All employees of the District shall share responsibility for supervising the behavior of students, and for seeing that they meet the standards of conduct established by the principal.

In accordance with State Statute 118.258, a School Board may adopt rules prohibiting a pupil from using an electronic communication device while on school premises. With permission of the building principal, a student may use such a device for medical, school, educational, vocational or other legitimate purpose as deemed appropriate by the principal as outlined in the student handbooks.

Each principal shall provide each pupil enrolled in the District a copy of this rule on an annual basis.

The School District shall not discriminate in standards and rules of behavior, including student harassment, on the basis of any protected category under state or federal law.
